



James C. Riley is vice president of the Land Combat product line at Raytheon Missile Systems. In this role, he is responsible for overseeing five major programs: the Tube-launched, Optically tracked, Wire-guided (TOW), Stinger, Javelin, Non Line of Sight-Launch System (NLOS-LS), and Excalibur programs.

Before joining Raytheon in January 2005, Riley assisted the U.S. Army in developing conceptual solutions to challenges presented by asymmetric warfare. He has also supported Headquarters Training and Doctrine Command's (TRADOC) Futures Center, developing doctrine, structure and capabilities requirements for the Future Force.

Riley is a retired Army lieutenant general. He served as the commanding general of the V Corps in Germany and the Combined Arms Center at Fort Leavenworth, Kan., and the deputy commander for TRADOC. Additionally, Riley served as the Defense Department and Central Command representative to the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, as a joint staff representative for European Security Matters and as a U.S. military representative to the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe.

During his distinguished Army career, Riley also commanded the 3rd Infantry Division (Mechanized) and V Corps. He is a Desert Shield/Desert Storm veteran and has served as the chief of the European Division on the Joint Staff.
