



Biography

Walter F. Doran is President of Raytheon Asia for Raytheon International Inc. In this role, he serves as a focal point for developing, coordinating, and implementing strategy across the region; provides guidance and direction for the country managers; and manages the regional budget. He additionally identifies and provides appropriate resources to pursue Navy strategic growth opportunities for Raytheon. He serves as the company's internal U.S. Navy subject matter expert, explaining the Navy's transformational goals, and linking Raytheon's business units to help the company shape integrated mission solutions to address customer needs.

Prior to joining Raytheon, he served in the U.S. Navy for more than 38 years. He held the rank of Admiral as Commander of the U.S. Pacific Fleet. He was responsible for the world's largest combined fleet command, encompassing 102 million square miles and more than 190 ships and submarines 1,400 aircraft, 191,000 Sailors and Marines and 30,000 civilians. Admiral Doran's shore assignments included numerous tours on the staff of the Chief of Naval Operations (CNO). From 1983 to 1985, he was military assistant to Vice President George Bush, responsible for Pacific area developments and arms control negotiations. Selected to flag rank in 1993, Admiral Doran served as Director for Operations, Plans and Political-Military Affairs on the CNO staff, and as Assistant to the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff from 2000.

His command tours included the USS Dewert and the USS Belknap, flagship for the U.S. Sixth Fleet. He commanded Amphibious Group One and Amphibious Force U.S. Seventh Fleet in Okinawa and Yokosuka, Japan, and served as Deputy Commander in Chief and Chief of Staff, U.S. Southern Command. He commanded the Seventh Fleet from 1998 to 2000.

In addition to earning a bachelor's degree from Villanova University, a master's degree in communications from Oklahoma University and a master's degree in defense studies from Madras University in India, Doran also attended the Indian Defense Services Staff College in Wellington, India.
