



Daniel L. Smith is a Raytheon Company vice president, and served as president of Raytheon's Integrated Defense Systems (IDS) business from 2003 to 2010. Raytheon Company (NYSE: RTN), with 2009 sales of \$25 billion, is a technology and innovation leader specializing in defense, homeland security and other government markets throughout the world. With headquarters in Waltham, Mass., Raytheon employs 75,000 people worldwide.

Smith, who will retire from Raytheon on July 30, 2010, was responsible for the operational excellence, citizenship and growth of the IDS business.
